Effective July 1, 2020: Mixed and Organics Recycling Bins Are Now Provided

AB827 requires businesses to provide customers **recycling** and **organics** bins to collect material consumed on the premises.

It also requires collection containers at “front-of-house” to be:

- ✓ visible
- ✓ easily accessible
- ✓ clearly marked
- ✓ adjacent to other trash containers
